The Problem: As Bob Dylan so aptly put it, “the times, they are a-changin’”. The profession of medicine is no more immune to the changing times than the culture and society we inhabit. 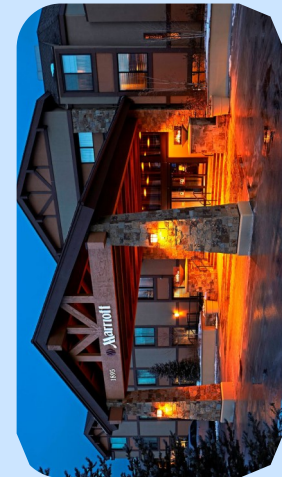
