UMANA Board of Directors Meets in St. Petersburg, FL

The Board of Directors of UMANA held its regular quarterly meeting on October 13th at the Sirata Beach Resort and Conference Center in St. Petersburg Beach, Florida. Responding to an invitation extended by the Florida Branch President **Dr. Taras Kochno**, UMANA National President **Dr. Ariadna Holynskyj** cheerfully convened the board to meet in the state hosting the newest of UMANA's 18 chapters.

The meeting opened on Saturday morning with greetings by Drs. Holynskyj and Kochno, followed by a routine session of association business. Florida branch members attending were Dr. and Mrs. Korol, Dr. Nataliya Rakowsky, Dr. Askold Mosijczuk, Dr. Eugene Steckiw, and Dr. Lyda Tymiak. The growth of the largest Ukrainian-American professional association continues,

with 2007 membership poised to eclipse last year's total of 496 active members.

A significant portion of the meeting was spent discussing the issue of finding a replacement editor-in-chief of the Journal of the Ukrainian Medical Association of North America (JUMANA). The board felt that it would be

beneficial to extend a search to all members on record, suggesting that they might form an editorial board to lessen the workload, and spread the responsibilities among themselves according to relevant skills and interests. At its recent convention this June, the Assembly of Delegates of UMANA voted to continue publication of JUMANA with specific changes regarding the editorial content and scope of the journal. The board is intent in complying with the wishes of the Assembly and proceeding with the intention and goals spelled out by the delegates.

Saturday afternoon was devoted to meeting with the Florida branch members. Dr. Kochno reported on the status of the chapter, summarizing the recent branch activity and exploring planning options for the upcoming year. Members eagerly volunteered for needed positions and encouraged Dr. Kochno to definitely proceed with plans for a Florida Branch meeting in the near future.

At the conclusion of the formal portion of the meeting, the board joined friends and relatives for a dinner cruise on the Starlight Princess, enjoying a pleasant meal to live music. Some UMANA members were so energized by the meeting that they felt the need to work off their excess energy on the small marine dance floor.



The next meeting of the UMANA board of directors is scheduled for February 2, 2008, in Chicago. This event coincides with the annual meeting of the UMANA Foundation as well as the UMANA Illinois Branch's Traditional Debutante Ball. Dr. Holynskyj and her officers look forward to a fruitful and wellattended meeting.

Ukrainian World Golf Challenge 5

The next Ukrainian Golf Challenge will be staged in Vancouver in the summer of 2008. As before, this will include Ukrainian competitors (and non-competitors) from Australia, the U.S., Great Britain, Germany, Canada, and this time there also will be a large contingent of native-born Ukrainian golfers from Kyiv. This is the first time Canada has had the honor to host this week-long event. Previous Challenges, held roughly every $2\frac{1}{2}$ years, were in Australia, Hawaii, Spain, and Florida. All together we're expecting over 180 people, including 120 golfers.

Five rounds of golf are to be played at a variety of prestigious

courses, a different one each day, including a full-day trip to the famous Whistler resort. The golf, hotel, many meals, bus transportation, and many other things are included in the cost.

Join in our 5th International Challenge for men and women of ALL golfing abilities. Meet new friends and promote camaraderie between countries and Ukrainian communities. Test your game against other Ukrainians and compete for your country in a true tournament environment.

Although registration opened January 14, 2007, there are people interested in the event who are just recently hearing about it. For this reason, we're issuing a broader notification that there are still openings available for the event.
