We expect that these directories, which will now be generally accessible, will serve as important resources for promoting humanitarian assistance, scientific information exchange, and the planning and coordination of future projects and initiatives. I encourage our members to provide us with additional entries of which they are aware or to submit additional information on existing entries.

Center in Detroit. She described the new designer drugs as providing a "legal high" to recreational drug users, including "Ecstasy" alternatives, amphetamine, and cathinone derivatives ("Bath Salts"), and synthetic cannabinoids (K2 & Spice). Additionally, the recently observed complications related to new adulterants of cocaine, such as levamisole, were discussed. Dr Baltarowich showed her true expertise in this unusual field of medicine.
